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Program Speakers



Jeffrey Jue is the Board Chair at Sun-Maid. He serves on the following committees: CoBank Association Leadership Committee, Farm Credit Council Representative, and serves as ex-officio member of the Board's Audit, Human Capital, and Risk Committees. Mr. Jue is a fourth generation farmer and president of Jue, LLC which is a farming and

agricultural limited liability company. Mr. Jue produces raisins, wine grapes, walnuts, pecans, and citrus. He also operates a fruit dehydrator specializing in golden raisins and raisin reconditioning. He has served on the Fresno Madera Farm Credit Board of Directors since 2007 with designation as a Financial Expert since 2008. He has served as the Board Chairman since 2012.



Megan W. Gerhardt, Ph.D. is a Professor of Management and Leadership at the Farmer School of Business at Miami University, specializing in individual and team leadership development, where she also serves as Co-Director of the Isaac & Oxley Center for Business Leadership. Her current research focuses on the leadership of multiple

generations in the workplace, and the power of the strengths based approach to development for young people. Dr. Gerhardt is a Gallup Certified Strengths Coach in the area of strengths based leadership. She is the owner of The Gerhardt Group, LLC, specializing in leadership development solutions.



Rod Kelsay is the Executive Director of the Mid America Cooperative Council. The council is an association of over 110 cooperatives that covers the states of Illinois, Indiana, Michigan and Ohio. The council's principle focus is cooperative education with over 5,700 attendees to their 250+ programs over the past 10 years. Rod has made

numerous presentations on cooperatives and has been quoted and published in cooperative magazines. Rod holds a masters (MS) degree from the University of Illinois and a BS degree from Purdue University. Rod is on the board of directors for the Association of Cooperative Educators, and Past President of the National Association of State Cooperatives.
